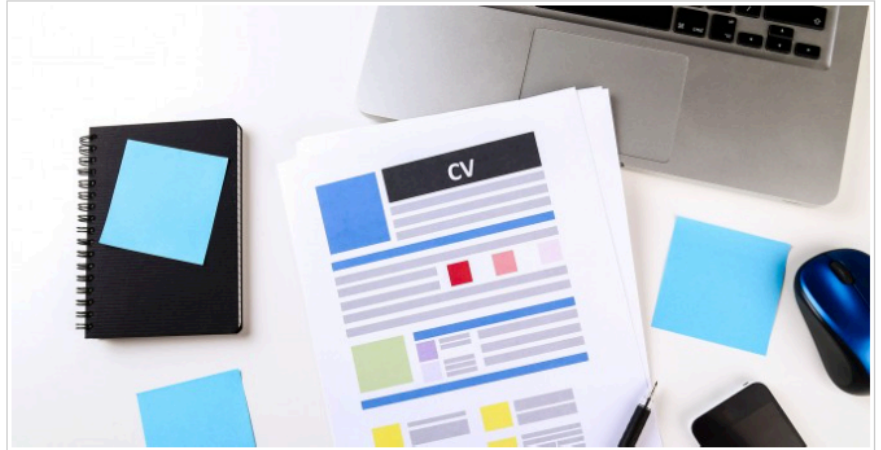





Here are some tips for nailing your job interview

Initially impressions – how someone presents himself or herself, how ready 1 is – are essential, she adds.

"Job seekers need to be undertaking all the things they can to tip the scales in their favor, such as paying interest to the smallest detail," added Diane Domeyer, executive director of the Creative Group.

Applicants really should, Domeyer advised, stay clear of superfluous info in a résumé or interview. This consists of complaining about prior employers. Another red flag, according to a recent poll, is the inappropriate use of telephones.

"Checking your smartphone isn't a wise move throughout a job interview," according to the Creative Group study. In truth, it says, it's the top rated way to blow your possibilities with a prospective employer.
